Our History

The All Sectors Netball League was conceived in 1990 among a group of stakeholders concerned with the development of the sport. They noted the general decline in participation in netball since the 1979 World Championships when Trinidad and Tobago won jointly with Australia and New Zealand. In this context, the group also noted the limited opportunities for employed women to participate in the sport; and to that end proposed the formation of a Netball Business League which evolved into the All Sectors Netball League (ASNL). The ASNL now boasts a proud 20 year history of facilitating the suitability of netball and promoting a “healthy lifestyle for women”¹.

Among the many achievements over the last two decades include two awards as the League of the Year in 1998 and 2000.

The number of teams has grown from thirteen teams in 1991 to twenty-three in 2009, participating in three Divisions – a Championship Division, an Alternative Division and a Retro Division for players over 40 years of age.

The League is also proud of its contribution to the sustainability of the sport of netball and the advancement of women through its initiatives to:

- ✦ Develop umpires and other officials through training and practice
- ✦ Sustain interest in the sport of netball among women
- ✦ Generate interest in netball among businesses in Trinidad and Tobago
- ✦ Create employment for gifted players in participating companies
- ✦ Provide personal development and life skills training for participants
- ✦ Promote health and wellness among women through the sport of netball

Our Constitution

Amended: December 04, 2002 (Item 10)

Amended: December 13, 2006 (Item 6 & 13)

1. NAME:

The League shall be called the ALL SECTORS NETBALL LEAGUE hereinafter referred to as the ASNL and shall be affiliated to the Trinidad and Tobago Netball Association.

2. COLOURS:

The colours shall be Green and White.

3. OBJECTIVES:

- a) To organise, promote, control and regulate the game of Netball in Trinidad and Tobago for Working Women under the International Federation of Netball Associations (IFNA) System
- b) To provide opportunities for the growth and development of Netball by the promotion of friendly tournaments.
- c) To encourage healthy rivalry and the development of proper social activities through the sport.
- d) To promote the social and economic well-being of participants and supporters of the League.
- e) To raise funds for the furtherance of the aims and objectives of the League.
- f) To develop a cadre of committed efficient and technically competent administrators and officials for the sport of Netball.
- g) To do all such other things as may be incidental to the attainment of the aims and objects of the League.

4. MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNCIL:

The League shall be governed by a Council, which shall consist of a representative of each affiliated organization. From these representatives the following officers shall be elected, President and Secretary.

5. POWER OF THE COUNCIL:

The Council shall be the governing Body of the League and all its decisions shall be final and binding.

6. COMMITTEES:

The Council shall appoint a Management Committee. The Management Committee, from among its members, shall appoint a Chief Executive Officer to manage the affairs of the League. The Council may also appoint any other committee that may be necessary. (Amended December 13, 2006)

7. CONDUCT OF MEETINGS:

At meetings of the Council, the President and in his/her absence, a member of the Council, who shall be duly elected at the meeting, shall preside.

Every member organization present shall be entitled to one vote. The Chairman shall have a casting vote.

Quorum

Fifty percent of the members shall form a quorum. If within one half hour from the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the following week at a place and time to be determined and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, the members present shall form a quorum.

8. CONVENING OF MEETINGS:

The Council shall meet at least once during the season, but for matters that require immediate attention, the Secretary shall call an emergency meeting of the Council.

9. MEMBERSHIP OF THE LEAGUE:

The League shall consist of such affiliated organizations playing Netball according to such laws, rules and regulations as the Council may approve.

All organizations before being affiliated to the League shall satisfy the Council that they are properly constituted bodies, that is, representatives of a Body, Company, Professional Group, Business Group playing Netball under the official Rules of the IFNA System only.

Honorary Membership:

If on account of service rendered to the League or the welfare of Netball in general or for any other reason the Council shall consider any individual worthy of honour, they shall have the power to elect such an individual to honorary membership of the League, providing the voting of the Council is unanimously in favour of the election. Honorary members may attend the meetings of the Council and take part in any discussions of the Council, but shall have no voting power.

10. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING:

The Annual General Meeting of the League shall be held at such time in November – December in each year at such place as the Council shall decide. (Amended December 04, 2002)

The Secretary shall give fourteen (14) clear days notice in writing to all affiliated Teams and Members entitled to attend the meeting. The Agenda specifying the business to be transacted thereat shall accompany such notice.

The Business of the Annual General Meeting shall be to receive, consider the Accounts and Balance sheet, the Secretary's Report on the activities of the League for the preceding year and any other Reports; to elect officers, to appoint Auditors; and to consider any other matter which the Council may propose, or of which at least fourteen (14) days previous notice in writing shall have been given to the Secretary.

11. AN EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING:

The Council shall convene an extraordinary general meeting, whenever it thinks fit, and it shall do so on a notification made by the Secretary.

Each affiliated member shall be entitled to two (2) representatives but one Vote at a General Meeting.

12. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS OF THE COUNCIL:

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Council. If the President is absent, a Chairman shall be elected from the Council.

The Secretary shall carefully keep the Minutes in which shall be recorded the business transacted at all meetings of the Council. He/she shall be in regular communication with the President in all matters affecting the interest and conduct of the League's affairs. He/she shall keep suitable records of all matches played under the auspices of the League.

13. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:

The responsibilities of the Management Committee may include: Administrative, Technical, Finance, Discipline, Selection and Awards, Public Relations etc. (Amended December 13, 2006)

14. AUDITORS:

At each Annual General Meeting of the Council, the Council shall appoint Auditors for the ensuing year. The Auditors shall audit the accounts of the League whenever the Council may think fit, but must do so at least once a year in time for their Report to be presented to the Annual General Meeting.

15. DATES OF THE SEASON:


The Season shall commence from the first month of the year and end on or before the 30th of April in each year, unless the Council thinks it fit to extend the duration of the Season in order to complete a competition.

16. ESTABLISHMENT OF RULES AND REGULATIONS:

The Council must approve all rules and regulations with reference to the League.

17. INTERPRETATION OF RULES:

The Council of the League is the sole authority for the interpretation of these rules and regulations, and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the League and not provided for by these rules or regulations shall be final and binding on every member




The ANSL 20th Anniversary Report commemorates the many accomplishments of the League in its twenty year history.

INTRODUCTION

The All Sectors Netball League (ASNL) is an affiliate of the Trinidad and Tobago Netball Association (TTNA).

The League began in 1991 with an objective to²:

- ✦ Provide an opportunity for working women to indulge in healthy and competitive play on a regular basis
- ✦ Cause corporate citizens to become involved in the netball movement
- ✦ Provide opportunities for families to recreate together in a safe and pleasant environment
- ✦ Make contributions towards the development of technical and administrative skills for the management of the discipline of netball

Emphasis is placed on growth and development, image, competition and customer satisfaction, both internally and externally³.

The League has three Divisions – a Championship Division, an Alternative Division and a Retro Division; the latter for players over the age of forty.

Games are held at the Eastern Regional Indoor Sporting Arena from 12:30 pm to 8:00 pm on Saturdays and three evenings a week from 5:30pm from January to March each year. Games are played in two categories in each Division – Round Robin and Knock Out.

Competitions include: the Opening Day Knock Out; the League Trophy; the Jean Pierre Challenge; the Divisional Knock Out; the Alternative Open Knock Out; the Courts Knock Out; the Colors Team Knock Out and FASTNET.





PLAYING THE GAME... 20 YEARS ON

The First Ten Years: 1991 - 2000

The ASNL celebrated its tenth anniversary in 2000.

The League's 10th Anniversary Report highlighted the many achievements of the first decade, from the humble beginnings at the Jean Pierre Sports Complex with a roster of thirteen teams; to the well-structured, highly anticipated League boasting eighteen competing teams from businesses in both the public and private sectors such as:

- ✘ The Telecommunications Services of Trinidad and Tobago Limited
- ✘ The Government Printery Sport Club
- ✘ The Trinidad and Tobago Postal Corporation
- ✘ The Trinidad and Tobago Defence Force
- ✘ The Trinidad and Tobago Fire Services
- ✘ The Trinidad and Tobago Police Service
- ✘ The Ministry of Education
- ✘ The Ministry of Health

- ✘ The Central Bank of Trinidad and Tobago
- ✘ The Caribbean Facilities Corporation
- ✘ ISPAT Industries Limited
- ✘ Neal & Massy Holdings Limited

During those early years the League grew from strength to strength; introducing innovations that drew the attention of the TTNA, the Ministry of Sport and corporate sponsors. Indeed, during that time corporate sponsors included Guardians Holdings Limited, Caribbean Airlines and Courts Trinidad Limited. The latter remains the main sponsor for the League.

In recognition of its many accomplishments, the ASNL was named League of the Year in 1998 and 2000.

In 1992, the League hosted the Antigua Business League and then the Barbados Netball Team in 1994. A reciprocal visit was made to Barbados in the same year.


Indeed, the League established a sound tradition of excellence in these early years.

THE TEAMS




Figure 1: Teams Participating 2000 - 2010

From 2000 to 2010 the number of teams participating in the League grew from 13 to 23 (see Figure 1), competing in various divisions. While teams kept changing over the period; teams Fire Services, TSTT, Police, Defence Force and Bermudez (in their various forms) have consistently competed in the League. The commitment of these loyalists is congratulated and the League looks forward to their ongoing support for the sport of netball in the years to come.




Figure 2: No. of Teams Annually By Division

Growth fluctuated in the Alternative Division, but there was an overall increase from seven (7) teams to thirteen (13) teams. However, the number of teams participating in the Championship Division has remained consistent at four since 2003. See Figure 2. A full list of teams competing each year is at Appendix 1.

Another main contributor to the overall increase in teams is the Retro Division which began in 2004. This innovation proved highly successful with six teams, varying from year to year, participating since inception. The new Division generated a special *esprit de coeur* as the matriarchs of the great game brought their sense of sorority to the League Competition.

Notwithstanding the overall increase in team participation, the League will continue to take steps to sustain and build interest in netball among businesses in Trinidad and Tobago through the annual competition, with a view to having new teams participate and by extension ensure the further development of the sport.

THE VENUE

Over the ten years, the ASNL enjoyed a wonderful partnership with the Eastern Regional Indoor Sporting Arena at Golden Grove, Tacarigua. The Arena's good location and quality facilities make it especially attractive for the League's annual competition; and other activities.



While there have been some challenges such as the lack of a PA System; clashing schedules with other activities and intermittent water shortages; the League is thankful for the continued support of the management of ERISA and look forward to continued collaboration.

At those times when the ERISA was not available, for example at the start of the 2004 season, the Ministry of Sport and the management of the Jean Pierre Sports Complex were quick to respond the League to use this facility. The ANSL is appreciative of the continued support of these partners and look forward to building on these relationships in the future.

THE COMPETITION

The structure of the competitions has remained consistent over the last ten years, building on the progress made in the first ten years.

The competitions are structured around three divisions – the Championship Division, the Alternative Division and the Retro Division which begun in 2004. In 2003, 2004, 2008 and 2009 the Alternate Division was separated in two spawning an Alternate X and an Alternate Y Division.

Teams in each Division participate in Round Robin and Knock Out games over the season. Round Robin games are one hour in duration, while Knock Out matches are 30 – 40 minutes long. The Competition Rules are at Appendix 2.

The various competitions over the years have been keen, generating excitement and both players and spectators alike, as winners and losers were often separated by one or two goals. There are eight competitions: the Opening Day Knock Out; the League Trophy; the Divisional Knock Out; the Courts Knock Out; the Jean Pierre Trophy⁵; the Alternate Open Knock Out; the Mixed Team Knock Out, which became the Mixed Colours Tournament 2006; and FASTNET. A summary of some competitions and the winners from 2000 to 2009 is at Appendix 3.

The League continued its tradition of innovation and achievement established in the first decade. Some of the highlights of the last ten years include:

2000

- ✦ Successful implementation of the 10th anniversary celebrations including an Awards Ceremony and an exhibition/display on the history of the League based on newspaper archives
- ✦ The “Gourmet-Q” was introduced as the main fundraiser for the League

- ✘ Participation in the International Olympic Committee's Women in Sport project by providing a history of the league and describing the initiatives to promote the participation of women in sport
- ✘ innovations to control abuse of stoppages for injury time

2002

- ✘ Seeding of teams
- ✘ Provision of brunch for players
- ✘ Introduction of additional awards for team and individual achievement

- ✘ Introduction of the Retro Division - Six teams (over 90 players) were part of the inaugural season

- ✘ The Leagues hosted a six session Umpires Development Seminar from April to May. Representatives for the participating teams were invited the Seminar which was facilitated by the International Umpires Committee and the TTNA Umpires Sub Committee
- ✘ The main sponsor, Courts Trinidad Limited quadrupled their contribution to the League

- ✦ The 2005 All-star Team had a successful tour St. Lucia in June

2006

- ✦ A follow-up session to the Umpires Seminar was over two weekends in April
- ✦ A Management Development Workshop was held in Oct 2006 facilitated by Odyssey Consulting, Dr. Iva Glouden of UWI SPEC, Ms. Marva De Freitas, the Alternative Dispute Resolution Programme and Grace Talma Associates. Forty-two persons attended including the executive of TTNA

2007

- ✦ A follow up to the Management Development Workshop was held in Feb 2007

2008

- ✦ An opportunity was created for exposure of the players in the Alternative Division. An All-star team conducted a tour of Grenada in June, winning two out of three games
- ✦ An innovative pilot programme was conducted targeting girls 6- 9 years, designed and implemented by Ms. Brenda Prince, one of the members of the League's Management Committee. The Programme aimed at generating renewed interest in netball among primary school girls. The pilot was implemented in three communities – Morvant/Laventille, Carenage and San Fernando in July and August. The facilitators of the Pilot were drawn from the Management Development Programme held in 2006/7



✘ An Umpires Development Forum was held on February 22nd. The Panel included Mr. Chris Campbell of Jamaica, umpire at final of netball world championships in 2007; Ms. Anne Marie Dickson, International Umpire; Ms. Carol Gittens of the National Umpiring Committee and Ms. Brenda Prince of the International Umpiring Committee.

✘ Joel Young Strong, coach of the Fire Services Team, was selected to umpire the regional Under 16 championships in Jamaica and AFNA championships in St. Vincent and the Grenadines in July. She then received the International Umpire Award in 2008.

Media Coverage


The League has been truly fortunate to have had extensive coverage of the leagues events over the past ten years in both the print and electronic media. Newspaper coverage extended to all three daily newspapers - the Guardian, Express and Newsday and the Wire. Television coverage was secured through TTT (up to 2004), TV 6, Gayelle (2005), IETV (2005), CNC 3 (from 2006), NCC 4 (from 2006) and Win TV (from 2008). In respect of Radio, Power 102 carried commentary on the games in 2002.

The League thanks the media for its steadfast support over the years and looks forward to working closely we these stakeholders for decades to come.

OUR CHALLENGES

There have been some challenges over the years. Among the more persistent included the perennial issues with the venue and concerns in managing the spectators attending the





games. In respect of the participating teams, there have been concerns with indiscipline, punctuality and default of games. A main concern over the period was the shortage of umpires.

To address issues the Executive of the League has and continues to work with all stakeholders to develop workable solutions. For example, in respect of the shortage of umpires the League hosted the series of Umpire development interventions between 2005 and 2008; while the matters raised by teams led to a review and amendment of the League Constitution and the Competition Rules.

THE FINANCIAL REPORT

The League Finances have remained healthy over the last decades driven by consistent contributions from the main sponsor, Courts Trinidad Limited, other sponsors and various fundraising activities.




Figure 3: ASNL's Income and Expenditure 2000 - 2008

Major fluctuations in expenditure occurred to fund tours to St. Lucia and Grenada in 2005 and 2008 respectively (see Figure 3).

Fund raising over the period proved difficult to sustain. In response, the League had teams make up front contributions at the beginning of the season.

ASNL's Income and Expenditure 2000 - 2008

CONCLUSION


The ASNL offer sincere appreciation to Courts Trinidad Limited and the many other stakeholders for their steadfast contribution to the League's success.

Appendix 2 COMPETITION RULES

1. Competition awards include trophies, medals and/or citations.
2. All challenge trophies are the property of the ASNL and are competed for annually by affiliated teams. Trophies are to be returned to any members of the Management Committee of the League not later than December 15 each year. Teams are wholly responsible for the trophies which they have won, and must replace any trophy lost or damaged while in their possession.
3. League games will be of one (1) hour's duration. The duration of the Knock Out games will be determined at the beginning of each season. Officials of teams are asked to ensure that the names of players who are submitted on their team lists are the players who are on the court for the game, particularly in respect of the shooters. Teams are asked to co-operate, as this will avoid stoppages during the games as well as embarrassment and unpleasantness with League officials and Team officials. With the exception of stoppages for injury or illness, the officials presiding at the table must be informed of substitutions to be made at least five (5) minutes before the substitution is made or at the beginning of the interval. Games will be played on the dates and times shown on the official fixtures. Team submission lists must be handed in to the officials at the table, fifteen (15) minutes before the start of the game.
4. Fees for the late start of a game will be thirty dollars (\$30.00). The maximum time allowed will be fifteen (15) minutes. The sum must be paid to the League official responsible for finance before that team's next scheduled game.
5. Fees for defaulting a game will be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00). This sum must be paid to the League official responsible for finance before that team's next scheduled game. Thirty dollars (\$30.00) of the defaulting fees will be paid to the team which won the game by default.
6. Teams must play in their registered playing uniform at all times. Footwear is part of the uniform. Playing initials are part of the uniform. Any team appearing for a game without playing initials, will be required to use playing initials supplied by the League for the game. A rental of ten dollars (\$10.00) will be charged, payable before use.
7. The Coach or Captain of the respective teams playing first are asked to report to officials at the table when the whistle is blown. All teams are to toss on their own and to indicate the result to the presiding officials of the game.
8. Each team must register a minimum of twelve players. Each team must have a court at all times during a game five (5) players who are EMPLOYEES of the company, profession or business group.
9. Team submission forms will be given to teams to facilitate the listing of players before the start of games. Substitution forms will also be available.
10. Teams are asked to co-operate to ensure that games begin at the appointed times.
11. Protest will be considered based on the following:
 - a. It must be within twenty-four (24) hours after the event
 - b. It must be written with the facts clearly stated
 - c. It must accompanied by a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) returnable only if the protest is successful.
